Work is underway for the pitched roof replacement of the main school building, which still has original tiles from 1928. There will also be fire improvement works on the inside of the building. Both of these projects have been funded by the government using its 'Condition Improvement Funding' (CIF) bid system. The bid process was started at the end of 2020 by our last Bursar, Elaine Beach, who served more than 30 years with us. These improvements will definitely serve as testament to her hard work and dedication to the school. The majority of the work will take place over the summer break.



Sutton Science Festival



Sutton Grammar School is delighted to be working with Successful Sutton on the Sutton Science Festival on 8 and 9 July. Parents may be aware of previous events that SGS students have enjoyed. On Friday, 8 July SGS will host more that 40 local schools at a Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths festival (STEM). We are also delighted that the Mayor of Sutton will be opening the event and awarding prizes at the end of the day. On Saturday, 9 July there will also be a Sutton High Street family festival, organised by our amazing Sutton Science Festival team.

We have over 20 exhibitors running interactive workshops throughout Friday, including building and testing of remote operating vehicles, sponsored by Subsea7, as well as a drone academy, a computer game challenge, smelly chemistry, immersive ten and six metre domes and many more.

SGS at Borough Sports






Running success for Adam



Huge congratulations to Adam Hudson (13z) (pictured left), who won silver in the 1500 metres at the Surrey Schools athletics championships recently. Adam has now been selected to go to the English Schools Athletic Championships in Manchester on 8 and 9 July. He recently participated in an open event in the 1500 where he ran 3:57.59, giving him the English Schools qualifying time.

If you have been inspired by Adam's story and enjoy running and athletics and want to progress and compete, why not join the local Sutton & District Athletics Club?



They offer structured training that will help you progress in middle-distance events such as 800m, 1500m or 3000m+ and also run cross-country during the autumn and winter.

Sutton & District AC is the only athletics club based in the London Borough of Sutton and trains athletes from 10 years (Year 6) upwards. Members include Borough County Champions and a number of international athletes, including in cross-country.

Big Bang finalist

Well done to Ivan Beresford (12Z) (pictured below) for making it into The Big Bang competition finals at the NEC in Birmingham last week.

His project was an automatic pill dispenser, which is a device that handles a user's medication, allowing them to go throughout their day without worry about timings or dosages. Hundreds of thousands of people suffer from incorrect medication usage every year and this is largely due to the patient having to manage medicine themselves. Ivan's solution involved creating a device which avoids technicality and difficulty through the use of an automatic pill dispenser controlled wirelessly by a mobile app. The mobile app can also be used by doctors if the patient is not techsavvy.

The automatic pill dispenser in the photo is a functioning prototype. Ivan received a lot of interest at the competition and has plans to develop it further.



Eligibility for free school meals

For many families, the coronavirus pandemic has meant a change in financial circumstances. If your circumstances have changed, you might want to consider whether you meet the criteria for free school meals.

You may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you receive).

By registering for free school meals you could save hundreds of pounds per year. In turn, the school will receive funding, known as Pupil Premium, for use within the general curriculum, as the government pays schools for each pupil registered.

For those students entitled to a free school meal, a daily sum is automatically added to the child's cashless card and they pass through the checkout in the same way as those paying for their meals.

If you meet the criteria and would like to apply for free school meals, please email Ms O'Connor in the school office. She will arrange a convenient time to call you and input all the relevant details into a secure government website to apply.

Sports Day information




