Start of term reminders and notices

As we start the new term, we would like to share some reminders, expectations and key information with you. Our key school policies can also be found <u>here</u>.

Special absence requests

We would like to remind parents wishing to take students out of school during term time that they must complete <u>this</u> absence request form. Once completed, the request form should be emailed to <u>absences@suttongrammar.sutton.sch.uk</u>. Please note the trustees have announced that absences in term time will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Forgotten school equipment

Please note our office staff will do their best to deliver forgotten items such as PE kits, homework and lunch boxes to students. However, the office is often very busy and we cannot guarantee that your child will receive late items in time for their lessons. If your child is aware you will be dropping something they need, please ask them to come to the office to collect it. This will hopefully ensure they have what they need at the right time.

Mobile phones

For the new school year 2022/23 we will maintain the ban of mobile phones and related technological devices from the school site for students in Years 7 – 11. Year 12 and 13 students have a specific area where they may use their mobile devices, this is the top floor of the Sixth Form Block.

The ban will be in force from the moment students enter the school site until the moment they leave the school site at the end of the day. Mobile phones seen during the school day will be confiscated and can be collected from the school office at the end of the day.

Drop off & pick up

Please can we remind parents to be considerate of the residents around the school when you are dropping off and picking up your child. Please do not park across driveways or block up the roads around the school.

Reporting a student absence

Please can parents notify the school of any absence using the following email - <u>absences@suttongrammar.sutton.sch.uk</u>. Please do not email Form Tutors or the Head of Year.

If you leave a voice message on the school absence line, please make sure you spell all names clearly and include the form of your child. This should be done by 8am on the day of absence and will help ensure our registers are accurate at the start of the school day, and will avoid the school emailing or calling to establish why your child is absent from school.

Disabilities of parents/carers

The school has a duty to ensure it meets the needs of people with disabilities who use its services. Through the admissions procedures, the school receives information about individual students who require special arrangements for their education. The school wants, however, to ensure that we are able to put any necessary arrangements in place for parents/carers with disabilities who may need to visit the school, for example for parents' evenings. If you have any disability which may affect how you access the school or have any suggestions for the school to improve your access to school events or information, please let us know by writing to the School Secretary or by sending an email to office@suttongrammar.sutton.sch.uk.

Label uniform items

Please make sure uniform, coats, bags, shoes and especially PE kit are labelled to ensure lost items can be reunited with their owners. If your child loses any item of uniform, please encourage them to look in the lost property box which is located near the Premises office.

Late arrival

We believe that all students are only able to achieve their potential if they attend school punctually and avoid missing lessons. If students are late they must register at the school office. If they do not register, an automated absence email is generated and sent to parents and carers to establish why a student is absent. For persistent late arrivals the school has a detention policy which is shown below.

3 late arrivals – an email is sent to parents for information

6 late arrivals – 30 minute detention – parents are forewarned

9 late arrivals – 1hr detention with the Deputy Head – parents are forewarned

12 late arrivals – 1hr & 15min detention with the Deputy Head – parents are invited into school for a meeting

Student records

We would like to remind parents and carers to ensure that all the contact and other details we hold for your child are correct. It is very important that your email address is the one that you currently use as all the information sent to you is via email. Please email the <u>school office</u> with any updated information.

School uniform reminder

Thank you to all parents and carers for their continued support with uniform, which makes our students look so smart. We expect all students to wear full school uniform at all times, including their journey to and from school. Students are also expected to wear their blazers/school jumpers, except for hot days when students may opt to carry these instead.

Lanyards

Students must wear lanyards with their ID badge at all times when in school. Any student who has lost their ID badge must report the loss to the school office. A new ID badge must then be paid for via <u>ParentPay</u> before a new one can be issued at a cost of £5. Broken or lost lanyards can be collected from the relevant Head of Year. The sanction for a student not wearing a lanyard with their ID badge is a 20-minute same day detention.

Canteen News

Students at SGS purchase their lunch and snacks by placing their finger on the Biometric Reader in the school canteen and snack shack. Payment is then deducted from their online account. Accounts must be topped up in advance using the <u>ParentPay</u> system. Parents are able to see what items have been purchased by logging into their <u>ParentPay</u> account and clicking on Transaction history and then Payment history. Whether these clubs or activities happen before the start of school, during break, lunchtime or after school, they all have the same goal of enriching our students. We aim to stimulate and extend students' passions, interests and knowledge. Students can choose to take part in competitive and recreational sports, musical activities, art, technology, history and many other activities. All of our extracurricular activities are inclusive and we encourage all of our students to take part and showcase their many talents.

Eligibility for free school meals

You may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you receive).

By registering for free school meals you could save hundreds of pounds per year. In turn, the school will receive funding, known as Pupil Premium, for use within the general curriculum, as the government pays schools for each pupil registered.

For those students entitled to a free school meal, a daily sum is automatically added to the child's cashless card and they pass through the checkout in the same way as those paying for their meals.

If you meet the criteria and would like to apply for free school meals, please email <u>Ms O'Connor</u> in the school office. She will arrange a convenient time to call you and input all the relevant details into a secure government website to apply.
